143. **APOLOGIES**

Apologies for absence were submitted from Councillors A J Cartwright, S R Rawlings, M Wade and Councillor N McIlveen (City of York Council).

144. **MINUTES**

The Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup>. February 2012, were considered; confirmed and signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

It had been noted that the car wash facilities (12/00106/FUL - Minutes 131 and 135 refers) was still operating. The Clerk advised of the service of an enforcement notice by the City of York Council upon the owner of the operation.

Councillor Mrs. Ellis advised that arrangements had been made for the provision of a skip on the Clifton Hospital Site. This skip would be sited in a week`s time (22<sup>nd</sup>. March) and Members were ask to offer their services in the collection of litter from the site, with other volunteers.

145. **COMMUNITY LAND**

1. Several reports had been received from Members and these were noted.
2. The Clerk reported that usual arrangements had been made for the mowing of the area from late March.

146. **COMMUNITY POLICING**

The Clerk submitted a recent police report, which was noted. PCSO Calvert gave some background information to the reduction in crime figures over the past month as reported.

147. **REPRESENTATIVES**

The Clerk reported upon a meeting of the YLCA Liaison Group earlier in the day, when there had been much discussion upon the subject of the introduction by the City of York Council of electronic planning systems. Note was taken of information received from the two other Ward Parish Councils on this matter.

It was reported that there would be no Ward funding in the next financial year, for the use of Parish Councils, due to the vast reduction in funding.

Information was received from the City of York Council in connection with Sunday `bus services on routes 112 and 113. The information was received and noted. Councillor Raw advised that he had submitted an observation upon this matter, which was supported.
