This was discussed at last week's Clifton (Without) Parish Council meeting. Thank you to Christian for attending the meeting to speak to the council.

The parish council were first notified about this significant matter on the 17th November and wish to express their disappointment in City of York Council's failure to consult sooner.

It is clear from the report you provided that this junction is emotive to the public and so it is only right that an open public consultation is undertaken to determine the best option.

The parish council would also respectfully remind the CYC that it declared a climate emergency in March 2019 and pledged to encourage sustainable travel, these proposals are potentially at odds with this pledge as they would introduce further hinderance to sustainable crossing of Clifton Moorgate.
